Foxboro Neighborhood Residents,

On behalf of the District, I would like to apologize for the continuing odor events you are experiencing. After we began receiving complaints in October 2019, we launched a concerted effort to identify and eliminate sources of nuisance odors from our site.

The District hired Jacobs Engineering to complete an odor study to identify odor sources and recommend corrective action to eliminate them. On July 31, 2020, the District received the final report from Jacobs Engineering outlining their recommendations. Within nine months we completed most of the work identified by the study and started a Vapor Odor Neutralizing System. Between April 18, 2021 when we completed that work and November 12, 2021, the District received only four odor complaints. This left us feeling optimistic that we had addressed the bulk of the sources leading to the nuisance odors. Contrary to what we believed, we now understand it was less that the odor issues had been resolved and more that we just weren't receiving the reports.

All but one of the improvements and procedures that were put in place before April 18, 2021 have been maintained. Since that time, we have also made several additional improvements. One improvement was to modify the Vapor Odor Neutralizing System to allow us to increase the amount of neutralizer that can be distributed through the system.

While designing the Wasatch Resource Recovery facility, we anticipated that the reception building would generate odors, so a biofilter and foul air system were constructed at a cost of well over \$600,000. What our research didn't reveal, and we didn't expect, was that we would encounter substantial odors from other sources. Below is a summary of just some of the investments we have made to address odors since the initial construction of the facility:

- Name / Phone Number
- Address Where the Odor Was Noticed
- Date and Time the Odor Was Noticed
- Description of the Odor
- Intensity (Strength) of the Odor (Light, Moderate, Strong, Very Strong)

Odor complaints that were received before the development of the **Online Odor Complaint Form** have been added to the



dashboard when sufficient data was provided (i.e. location, date, time). Please note that names, phone numbers and email addresses are not available through the public dashboard to respect residents' privacy.

We understand the frustration and reporting fatigue you've experienced and are grateful for your continued efforts. Our hope is that the feedback you provide can help us prioritize our efforts to identify and reduce odor sources.

Based on community input, we're working on a plan to communicate significant operational and process changes in real time. You will be able to find these updates on the District's website.
